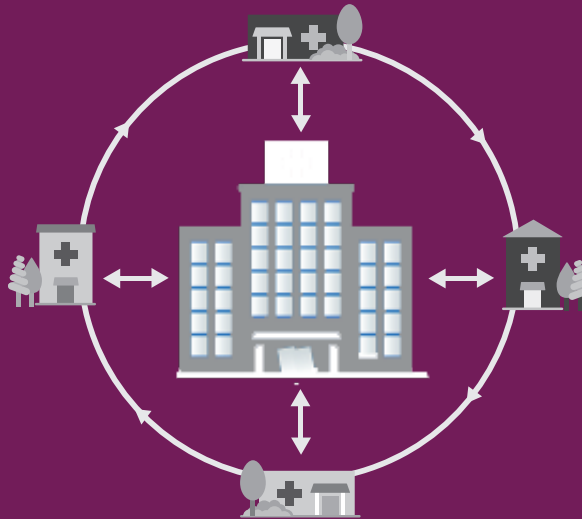

The Addiction Technology Transfer Center (ATTC) Center of Excellence on Behavioral Health for Pregnant and Postpartum Women and Their Families (CoE-PPW) and the ATTC Network Coordinating Office are partnering to pilot the PPW Project ECHO. The PPW Project ECHO pilot aims to:

1. Develop capacity to safely and effectively treat family members impacted by substance use disorders (SUD) and to monitor outcomes, and
2. Develop a model to treat complex SUD and co-occurring disorder conditions in PPW Grantee locations throughout the U.S. The pilot will begin in Fall 2016 and is open to PPW Grantees, although future rounds may be open to a broader audience.
